Adewoye CRIN, Ibadan and seconded by Mr. D. William Niger Delta University, Bayelsa State.</p> <p>⁶b) <u>Opening Prayer</u> ⁷The meeting commenced at 2:25pm with an opening prayer by Mr. Ojebode Lawrence. (External Auditor)</p> <p>⁹c) <u>Opening Formalities</u> ¹⁰The Registrar/DG/CEO of the Institute Mr. Y.H. Gbadegesin welcomed members ¹¹to the meeting. He appreciated them for their patience since the beginning of the ¹²Conference. He appreciated the ASLTON National Executive, the State ¹³Chairman, the LOC members and the management of UNN. While quoting ¹⁴Section 4(4) of the Act that established the Institute, he said the first business of ¹⁵the day was the nomination of a Chairman to preside over the meeting since the ¹⁶Institute’s Council was not yet in place. The motion for the 61 adoption of the minutes for discussion was moved by <i>Mr. Ayeke Patrick</i> from 62 Delta State University, Abraka and seconded by Mrs. Awonuga Morounfolo A.M. 63 from the Osun State University, Osogbo.</p> <p>64 a) <u>Attendance</u></p> <p>65 The Registrar/Director-General reported that due to the bulkiness of the 66 attendance register it was not printed and attached to the minutes but rather it was 67 pasted on the Institutes website where members can access it.</p> <p>68 b) <u>Discrimination Against SLT Professionals by Medical Laboratory</u> 69 <u>Counterparts</u></p> <p>70 The Registrar/Director-General reported that the matter was earlier discussed at 71 the ASLTON General Assembly. He said the Federal Ministry of Science and 72 Technology was systematically handling it and that a letter had already been sent</p>

73by the FMST to the office of the Head of Civil Service of the Federation. He
74informed members that office of the HOS would sort it out and arrange a meeting
75between NISLT and MLSCN He further reported that the medical association was
76responsible for the problem and not the medical Institute. He however gave
77assurances that before the next general meeting the matter would have been
78resolved.

79**Mr. W. Ebaddan**, University of Ibadan suggested that the Registrar/Director-
80General should do all within his power to fast track the meeting between the two
81Institutes with the aim of a quick resolution of the matter. He also advised that the
82Institute should improve on its publicity drive.

83The Registrar/Director-General in his response said the meeting being planned
84was at a higher level. He appealed for a little patience from members on the
85matter.

86 **a) NISLT Governing Council**

87The Registrar/Director-General reported that several letters were written to the
88Ministry on the reconstitution of the Governing Council of the Institute. He
89informed that approval to that effect has been received and ASLTON duly notified
90to commence the election of zonal representatives into Council. He said the
91Federal Ministries of Science and Technology, Education and Finance have also
92been informed and requests for their nominations to Council.

93 **b) PMTE Program**

94The Registrar/Director-General reported that two modules of the PMTE
95examination have already been concluded. He said the third module would soon
96commence so as to round up the program by December provided no candidate
97failed that would lead to a re-sit of the examination. He informed that
98examinations took place at the four centers designated for it.

99**Mr. Debekeme William**, Niger Delta University, Bayelsa appealed that the
100success of the program should be measured before cancelling it. He said more
101people were still interested in joining the profession through the program and if
102possible it should be extended to accommodate more people.

103The Registrar/Director-General in his response said it was only the Council when
104constituted that could take such decision.

105The Chairman however advised him to forward his appeal in writing to the
106Institute.

107 **c) Scheme of Service**

108 The Registrar/Director-General reported that he met severally with the staff
109 concerned at the office of the HOS and after the meeting of the Council on
110 Establishment the report that reached him was favorable. He however informed
111 that the implementation may face a little problem because of payment to
112 internship through IPPIS who would be paid level 9 salary. He reported that the
113 entry level for professional members was now level 10. He said he was hopeful
114 that by January 2018 everything would have been sorted out.

115 **Mr. W. Ebaddan**, University of Ibadan asked whether the new entry level for
116 members would also apply in Universities. He also asked about the effect of the
117 new scheme on members who cannot aspire to the peak of their careers in some
118 Research Institutes.

119 The Registrar/Director-General in response assured that the new scheme would
120 take care of the issues he raised.

121 **Mr. A.O. Iyamu** (National Chairman of ASLTON) assured members that soon
122 the new scheme of service would be signed and would take care of all the
123 concerns raised by members. He charged the members to write formerly to the
124 Institute and ASLTON if they have any problem in their places of work
125 particularly on promotion. He acknowledged the efforts of the former Director-
126 General towards having a new scheme of service for members.

127 **Mr. B. Osunuga**, University of Ibadan asked who was responsible for payment of
128 internship. He said in his opinion the government should be responsible for their
129 payment. He advised that the Institute and ASLTON should work together to
130 ensure that the government was responsible for payment of entitlements to SLT
131 graduands on internship.

132 **Mr. Ovu E. Osagie**, University of Benin asked whether the incremental steps in
133 the new scheme of service would affect all those already in service as done by
134 Medical Lab to favor their members. He also asked whether the position of
135 Assistant Chief and other irrelevant positions have been removed from the
136 Scheme of Service.

137 The Registrar/Director-General in his response answered in the affirmative to the
138 first question asked but noted that the process needs funding. He solicited for
139 support from all members to be able to actualize the scheme.

140 **Mr. J. Nichodemus** said he was against the Institute having a peace meeting with
141 the Medical Lab rather the Institute should find a way to be strong on its own.

<p>33.04 Presentation of 2016 Annual Management and Auditors Reports</p>	<p>142 The Chairman asked him to submit documents that can assist on the matter to the 143 Institute.</p> <p>144 d) Validity of NISLT Annual License to Practice 145 <i>Mr. E.B. Owoyemi</i>, NISLT Ibadan suggested that the validity of the Institute’s 146 annual license to practice should be discussed. He also suggested that the 147 incoming Council should make appointment of Directors in the Institute a matter 148 of priority for the smooth running of the profession.</p> <p>149 e) Election of NISLT Council 150 <i>Mr. B. Osunuga</i>, University of Ibadan enjoined ASLTON to expedite action on 151 the reconstitution of Council. He noted that a Committee was set up at the 152 ASLTON General Assembly and it is expected that the Committee should 153 conclude its business and present its report at the meeting for discussions.</p> <p>154 The Registrar/Director-General in response said he was expecting the Committee 155 to submit its report through the NEC but if the Chairman or Secretary was 156 available the report could be presented and discussed at the meeting.</p> <p>157 The Registrar/Director-General reported that ID Gbotosho & Co. (Chartered 158 Accountant) was no longer the Institute’s external Auditor. He said he had served 159 the required number of years as NISLT External Auditor as stipulated by law. He 160 informed that <u><i>Mr. Ojebode Lawrence</i></u> was the new External Auditor of the 161 Institute. He then introduced him to members.</p> <p>162 The following reports were thereafter presented: 163 a) Management Report: - The report was presented by the Registrar/Director- 164 General of the Institute, <i>Mr. Y.H.Gbadegesin</i> 165 b) Auditor’s Report: - The Auditor’s report was presented by the Institute’s new 166 External Auditors <i>Mr. Ojebode Lawrence</i>.</p> <p>167 <u>Adoption and Acceptance of the Reports for Discussion</u> 168 The Chairman on behalf of members thanked the Registrar/Director-General and 169 the new External Auditor for their reports. He called for the adoption and 170 acceptance of the reports for discussions.</p> <p>171 <u>a) Adoption</u> 172 <i>Alh. A.A. Yusuff</i>, IAR&T, Ibadan moved the motion for the adoption of both the 173 Management & Auditor’s Report for discussion and it was seconded by <i>Mr. N.A.</i> 174 <i>Adegoke</i>, Federal College of Education, Eha-Amufu Enugu State.</p> <p>175 <u>b) Deliberation on the Reports</u> 176 <i>Mr. A.O. Iyamu</i> (National Chairman of ASLTON) FRIN, Ibadan commended the 177 effort of the Registrar/Director-General for the laudable steps taken to move the 178 Institute and ASLTON forward. He expressed worry over placing the</p>

179responsibility of organizing Conferences on ASLTON stating that due to
180financial constraints it may not be feasible. He appealed that the decision should
181be stepped down for now.

182The Registrar/Director-General in his response informed that the Act that
183established the Institute stipulates that the Institute shall organize the meeting for
184members once every year and since ASLTON Chairman has said the association
185cannot take up the responsibility; NISLT would continue and ensure the planning
186of conferences early.

187**Mr. A.O. Ishola (NISLT)** suggested that the amount allocated to staff training
188should be increased. He recommended that staff should be exposed to at least one
189international training within two years.

190**Mr. E.O. Ovu**, University of Benin said members should be allowed to register
191through their various branches and should be discouraged from bypassing their
192branches when paying their dues as such action is starving ASLTON of funds. On
193the professional seal of the Institute he suggested that it should be restricted to
194members that studied SLT only and not general. He commended the Director-
195General for helping members receive documents that enhances their welfare but
196he however suggested that such documents should be distributed to ASLTON
197branches. Finally, he suggested that NISLT and ASLTON should collaborate in
198hosting Conferences.

199**Mr. O.I. Adeyosoye**, Obafemi Awolowo University, Ile Ife observed that the
200current membership process was not encouraging, he enjoined the Institute to put
201in more efforts towards weeding quacks from working in science laboratories
202across the Country as this would provide job opportunities to members and
203increase the membership strength of the Institute as well as increase internally
204generated revenue. He talked about the laboratory in the Institute noting that
205some of the equipment therein were not functional, he advised that Management
206should do all within its powers to make the laboratory a reference laboratory for
207service delivery. He suggested that ASLTON leadership should be drafted into
208the radio program ‘science and you’ organized by the Institute as foot soldiers.

209The Registrar/Director-General in his response to the issues raised by members
210said the Institute was putting great efforts at weeding quacks from the profession.
211On the issue of the laboratory in the Institute he gave assurances that soon new
212equipment would be commissioned and the laboratory would become very
213functional. On the radio program he said it would be expanded in the year 2018 to
214include many stakeholders stressing that it was also raised at a meeting with the
215Honorable Minister for Science and Technology.

216On the issue of staff training he said it was very important to Management noting

He assured that specific training 218would be worked on that would ensure that staff were trained in their areas of 219specializations. On international training he reported that a memo received from 220the Secretary to the Government of the Federation states that approval for 221international training would be given if the training does not require government 222funding.</p> <p>223On the seal for members he said its only members who have facilities that could 224be given the Institutes professional seal.</p> <p>225On SLT laboratory minimum standards, he informed the house that the standard 226had since been reviewed in collaboration with FME and UNESCO but still with 227the press for publishing.</p> <p>228On organizing Conferences, he gave assurance that the Institute would always 229play a leadership role; he however suggested that subsequent Conferences should 230be organized in Abuja to make it easier for members to attend due to its central 231proximity to States.</p> <p>232He enjoined members to always write to the Institute if they needed any 233document.</p> <p>234The Chairman called for the report of the Council Pre-constitution Committee to 235be presented for consideration by members.</p> <p>236Mr. A.O. Iyamu (National Chairman of ASLTON) FRIN, Ibadan reported that 237the expanded NEC meeting of ASLTON called for recommendation from 238members on rules that would guide election of Council members and the matter 239was also raised at the ASLTON General Assembly. He said the expanded 240ASLTON NEC was the only body saddled with the power to make guidelines for 241the election into Council. He suggested that the ASLTON expanded NEC should 242be allowed to work on the guidelines as the report was just presented to him 243during the ongoing meeting.</p> <p>244Dr. I.F. Ijagbone, the Immediate past Registrar/Director-General of the Institute 245said the dissolution of the past Council posed a big challenge during his tenure as 246he was accused of asking the government to dissolve the Council. While advising 247that nothing should go against the formation of Council he suggested that a time 248line should be set for each zone to elect their representatives. He appealed for the 249cooperation of all members on the matter particularly the ASLTON Chairman.</p> <p>250Mr. O.I. Adeyosoye, Obafemi Awolowo University, Ile Ife said the report of the 251Committee should be presented since the AGM was a legitimate assembly of all 252the professional members of the Institute and by extension ASLTON.</p>

He ²⁸²said that as agreed by members, the extended ASLTON NEC would meet at a ²⁸³later date to discuss and finalize on the election guidelines for the reconstitution ²⁸⁴of NISLT Governing Council.</p>
